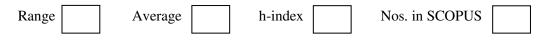



The feedback of teaching programme is obtained through discussion among the departmental colleagues and the Head of the Departments.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The college executes the Teaching Plan as per the Academic Calendar, which is prepared before the commencement of the Academic Year. Test, tutorials and seminars conducted regularly as per the programme. After the continuous and effective teaching and the completion of the entire syllabus, the students face the final university exams. The evaluation of the papers is done at the university level.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The colleges encourage every faculty member to undertake research activities. The study leave is sanctioned to teachers for carrying out full time research under Faculty Improvement Programme (FIP) to complete Ph. D. They were also encouraged to participate in various innovative programmes such as, Training programmes, STC courses, National and international conferences, seminars, workshops, symposia, orientation and refresher courses in order to enhance and update their knowledge. They also encouraged to prepare and publish their research work in research journals, conferences, seminars, workshops etc. The faculty members are encouraged for preparing proposals of Major and Minor research projects for assistance from different funding agencies.

Best Practices (2014-2015)

Name of the Best Practice: Centre for social Research Action

Objective:

To arose social consciousness among students and teachers and to apply their educational knowledge to society.

Need addressed and the Context:-

Students need an opportunity to work with under privileged section of society and upgrade their knowledge and experience through community services.

The Practice :-

Our college is situated in rural area. Most of our students are from peasants families. Small farmers as well as large farmers have not an idea of their land of quality, fertility, needs of fertilizers and their scale etc. in the same way most of rural peoples have no idea of their drinking water and hazardous minerals mixed in water. Hence we have decided to check the quality and drinking water of nearby villages and suggested them possible remedies. Hence our students and teachers could interact with villagers, know their problems meet with different types of challenges etc.

Evidence of success:-

The response of these peasants who have benefited from these programmes is very positive. Experimental and demonstrative knowledge was in front of students and their teachers. Before checking quality of land its constituent parts, water, its ingredients students and teachers interacted with different question to that particular farmers. Students get feedback and farmers get solutions to their problems. Maximum samples of water in this area are hazardous for health.

Resources:-

The programme is run by Botany and Zoology department. Apparatus like Soil and Water Analysis kit was used for checking soil and water parameters. Chemicals and other apparatus used from the Botany and Zoology laboratories.

Samples of soil and water were collected from nearby farmers with help of students.

No fees charged to farmers by college. It is one type of test and trial diagnosis.

2. Women Empowerment

Objective of the Practice:-

To design curriculum for women empowerment.

Need Addressed and the context:

To enable women school dropouts to pursue university education.

To make rural women self-sufficient.

The practice:

In rural area women education is not comparable to male. It is far behind. Our women teachers made a concrete plan for the year in advance. The plan put in front of IQAC members, they suggested some improvement and finalized the plan. All our women teachers collected information about the women/daughters who had left education because of poverty or any other social reasons. Maximum number of that women's were married. Hence our team approached their native places on Saturdays and Sundays. Summoned their care takers and pursued them to continue education of that dropped out females. Thus they admitted either in Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University or our regular College.

Following are the practices we cultivated for this programme:

- 1. Data collection about women who left education in their half way in our Ashti taluka.
- 2. Visit to their native places.
- 3. Persuasion for pursuing education.
- 4. Information about self help groups

Evidence of Success:- Cooperation among our families strengthened. Strength of women candidates for Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University or our regular courses increased.

Resources required:

All female teachers of our college.
